## COURSE DESCRIPTION AND INTENT:

The primary goal of Senior Studio is:

 To create the context for students to develop and realize an ambitious and self-defined creative project. With the guidance of faculty, each student will pursue their own artistic goals and develop their ability to sustain focused artistic activity while creating a coherent body of work.

Additionally, Senior Studio will help students to:

- Foster a community and shared sense of purpose in an atmosphere of mutual support, knowledge exchange and camaraderie;
- Cultivate professional practice skills and preparation for life after graduation;
- Participate in studio visits with a multidisciplinary team of faculty, visiting artists and critics.
- Collaboratively produce a successful Open Studios event on the last day of the semester.

### **EXPECTATIONS:**

We expect you to work hard and productively on doing something that you are passionate about. Your project must express coherence, depth, and quality surpassing anything you have yet attempted. Whatever you do, do it boldly. Be ambitious – this is your chance to really do something amazing with the skills you have gained over the last three years. You will have all the resources of the University at your disposal; use them to do something extraordinary!

You are free to design a body of work that is anything you want it to be. You may choose to try something entirely new that you have been unable to develop in more structured classes. You may want to concentrate on an aspect of your present practice with increased focus. You may be interested in exploring a new direction informed by recent research. It may be a series of related works on a common theme, or a multimedia performance extravaganza, or a monolithic project that goes through an extensive process of research, prototyping, manufacturing, etc. Whatever your project, you must plan it and tackle it in such a way that you are always making concrete progress towards successful completion. Remember that this course is your capstone!

Remember that for those of you enrolled in Extended Studio, this course is worth 20 credits per semester! You should produce an impressive amount of work, and should work regularly outside of class time. We encourage you to connect your Senior Studio work with the work that you are doing in your other studio course (if you have one). It is your responsibility to communicate clearly with all faculty involved if you are combining work for multiple courses.

In the first two weeks of the Spring semester, each student will have a Senior Review, at which they will present their work to a panel of faculty for review and advice. This advice should inform each student's plans for their thesis work. Students should prepare a selection of 10-20 images of previous work, a biography, a resume and an up-to-date artist statement to show at the Open Studios in preparation for the review. Senior Studio will also incorporate workshops on a variety of themes. Technical instruction and workshops will be offered as needed to advance student work.

ARTIST STATEMENT & SENIOR STUDIO PROPOSAL: Students should have the proposal due in the first week of class and a copy of the artist's statement sent to the assigned faculty member by September 6th. These should also be posted on the studio wall so faculty may consult with these in conjunction with studio visits. Artist statements are evolving so please keep these updated to reflect your current work.

#### SCHEDULE:

We will begin each Monday afternoon at 1:30PM in CFA 303. This time will be used for announcements, workshops and presentations as scheduled as well as to sign up for studio visits with faculty. After this initial group check in, students will then disburse to studios. Wednesdays will primarily be devoted to studio work and individual meetings with faculty. Students will sign in in CFA 303 and then go to their studios or to other spaces as indicated on the sign-in sheet. Evenings will be primarily devoted to studio work. The majority of the time for Senior Studio will involve working in your studio.

#### STUDIO VISITS:

You must meet *individually* with *each* of the three faculty and the graduate assistants on the team *at least* twice over the semester. That means a minimum of 8 appointments with members of the teaching team. This does not include the group critiques which provide more dialogue with the team and peers. You may opt to schedule more than one, but no more than two, meetings in a single class session. This will all be easy when you show up weekly to schedule your appointments.

## STUDENT EVALUATION CRITERIA:

### **PARTICIPATION:**

Active and engaged participation in your work and the work of others is essential to your success in this course. It not only benefits your growth as an artist but is also beneficial to your peers.

#### ATTENDANCE:

Attendance at all scheduled classes is mandatory; According to School of Art Attendance Policy, three absences from group or individual meetings will result in a reduction of one full letter grade.

### LECTURE SERIES ATTENDANCE:

As part of this course, you are required to attend the School of Art Lecture Series. There are approximately six lectures this semester, covering a wide range of artistic approaches. You will need to personally sign-in at all lectures with Lee Webster. If you miss a lecture due to other obligations, you can make up for your absence by writing a one-page paper about the artist whose lecture you missed. Papers must be submitted within one week of missed lecture.

#### **GRADING:**

Grades will be assigned using the university criteria:

A—Excellent, work moves beyond assignments; performs at a level which is visibly outstanding.

**B**—Very good, high quality work

C-Average, just completed assignments

**D**—Unacceptable

- Prepared to enter Phase II (S17) of Senior Studio, working towards graduation in order to enter the contemporary art world at a professional level or to pursue alternative post graduation goals.
